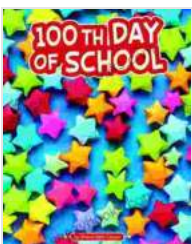


Students collaborating and applying their math skills by solving math problems for the 100th day of school.

- **Volunteer in the classroom:** Parents can volunteer to help with activities such as counting to 100,



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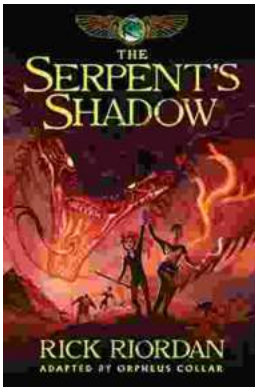
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
