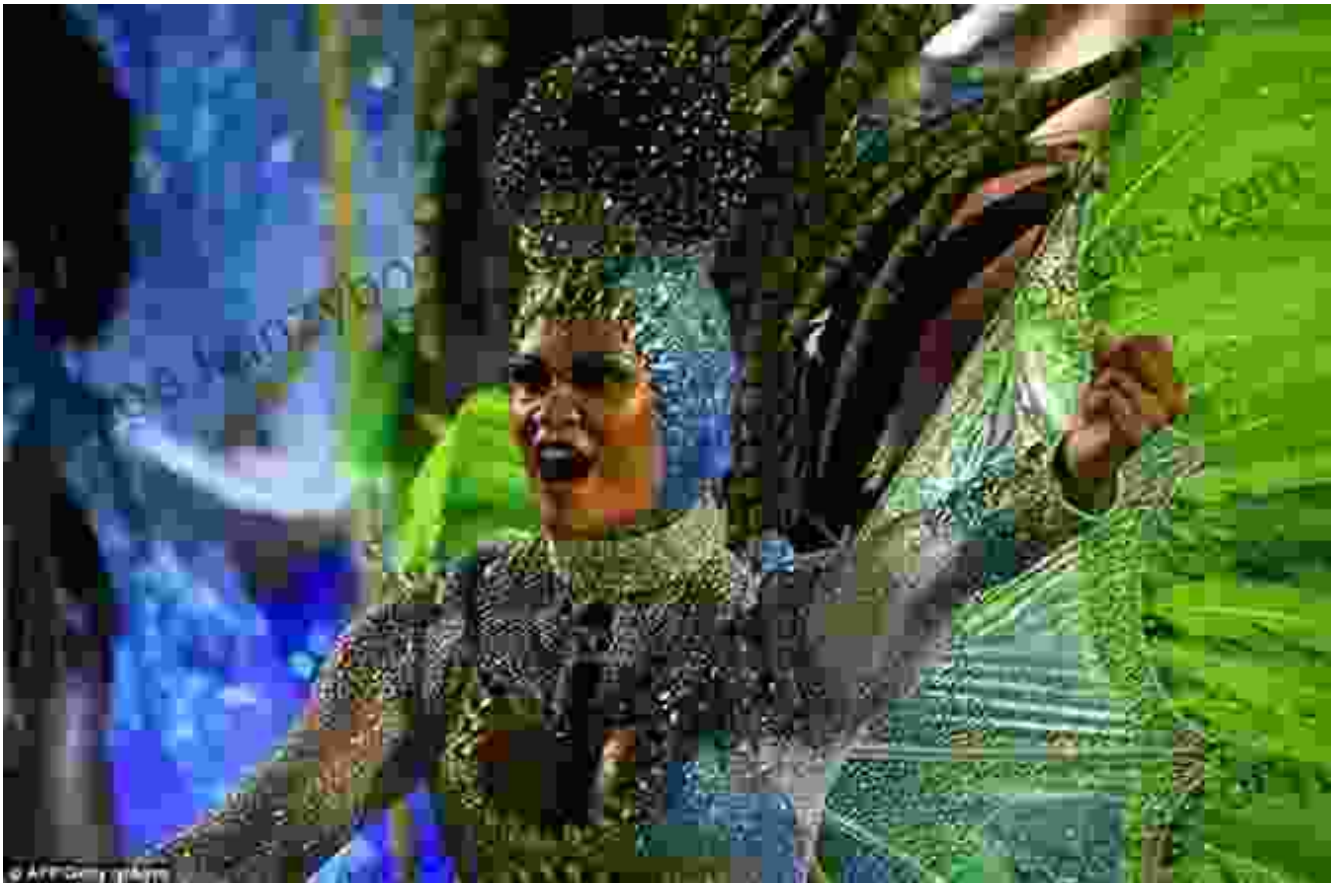


Rio Carnival

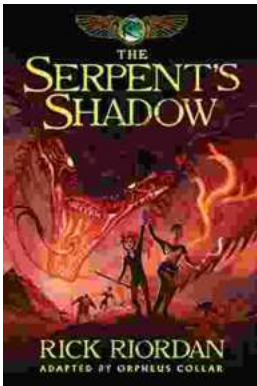
