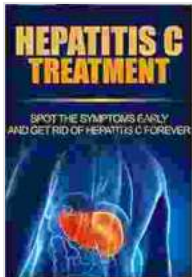

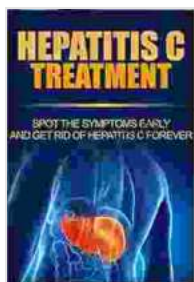
Prevention of Hepatitis
